AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH BLACK AND VEATCH FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES IN CONNECTION WITH THE SEWER ISSUES IN THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Black and Veatch has reviewed information relative to the City's sewer system and has made recommendation for addressing flooding issue long term; and

WHEREAS, Black and Veatch has proposed to prepare the scope of services and coordinate the collection of information for other work to be performed.

WHEREAS, Black and Veatch can also provide necessary professional services to develop a collection system model, detailed GIS data analysis and development of a GIS database, determine performance standards for the collection system, develop analysis to improve the system, and provide an expandable model of other areas of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with Black and Veatch in the amount of One Hundred Twenty-Six Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$126,400.00) for the purpose of preparing the scope and coordinating the collection of information in connection with the sewer flooding issue in the City and developing collection system models and related work, to be paid from Sanitary Sewer Fund (510).


SECTION 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare and to immediately begin the process of evaluating the systems and provided it receives the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
