

**A RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING**  
**Ellen R. Papadimoulis**  
**ON HER RETIREMENT**

**Whereas**, Ellen R. Papadimoulis, a resident of Fairview Park, is retiring from the US Department of Veterans Affairs, Louis Stokes Cleveland VA Medical Center (LSCVAMC) on January 2, 2015, after providing 41 years of exceptional service; and

**Whereas**, she obtained a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology, from Baldwin-Wallace College in 1972, graduating cum laude. She went on to graduate from Case Western Reserve University's School of Applied Social Sciences with a Master of Science in Social Administration in 1974; and

**Whereas**, Ellen married Aristotle "Tely" Papadimoulis on August 25, 1973. Together they raised two sons; Alexander and Nicholas. Ellen has one grandchild named Greyson, whom she dearly adores. Tely and Ellen were married for 38 years until his untimely death in 2011; and

**Whereas**, Ellen most recently served as Chief of the Blind Rehabilitation Center and Blind Rehabilitation Service at the LSCVAMC. Prior to becoming Chief of the Blind Rehabilitation Center, Ellen functioned as the Visual Impairment Services Team Coordinator for 28 years, where she coordinated a service delivery system for over 800 blind veterans and families in northeastern Ohio; and

**Whereas**, Ellen helped plan and design all aspects of the Cleveland Blind Rehabilitation Center (BRC) with the design team and activated the 15-bed inpatient unit in August 2011. She hired staff and supervisors for the unit, and was responsible for everything from planning to evaluation of the program. Last month, she accomplished the arduous task of obtaining certification from the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities for the BRC. Her tenacity, thoroughness, and compassion for veterans and the Cleveland BRC are considered models in "best practices" for the provision of Blind Rehabilitation Services within the entire Veterans Affairs system; and

**Whereas**, over the past 34 years, Ellen has been the recipient of numerous professional awards and certificates. Most recently, she received the Disabled American Veterans Outstanding VHA Employee of 2012 National Award and was a finalist for the prestigious United States Department of Veterans Affairs' Olin Teague Award in 2011; and

**Whereas**, Ellen has been a contributing member of numerous organizations in Fairview Park. She is currently a Board Member At-Large for the Fairview Park Junior Women's Club, and is also a member of the North Coast Needlers Quilt Guild. Among her list of things to do in her retirement, Ellen has plans to enjoy herself by travelling locally and internationally, spending more time with family and friends, and actively gardening; and

**Whereas**, not only will Ellen be missed by her immediate staff, but the entire local and national blind rehabilitation community, who thank her for her contribution to the profession and wishes her well.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:**



AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH LEBANON FORD FOR THE PURCHASE OF FOUR (4) NEW FORD POLICE INTERCEPTOR VEHICLES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Police Department is in need of four (4) new Ford Police Interceptor vehicles in order to properly maintain City services; and

WHEREAS, the police vehicles can be purchased from Lebanon Ford, 770 Columbus Avenue, Lebanon, Ohio, an authorized vendor who offers such vehicles at a price determined by the General Services Administration for the State of Ohio.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:**


SECTION 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Lebanon Ford, an authorized vendor who offers such vehicles to the City at a price determined by the General Services Administration for the State of Ohio, for the purchase of four (4) new Ford Police Interceptor vehicles.

SECTION 2. That the cost of the purchase of the four (4) Ford Police Interceptor vehicles in an amount not to exceed One Hundred Six Thousand Dollars (\$106,000.00) will be paid from the Permanent Improvement Fund (260).

SECTION 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare and so that the order for the police vehicles may be placed as soon as possible to maintain the current pricing , and provided it receives the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force from immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.



AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF SERVICE AND DEVELOPMENT TO REQUEST PROPOSALS FOR AND THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT, AS APPROVED BY THE BOARD OF CONTROL FOR PROFESSIONAL DESIGN SERVICES FOR INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS IN CONNECTION WITH THE SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL PROGRAM AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the United States Congress has set aside funds for Safe Routes to School projects through the Ohio Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview Park was awarded a grant from the Ohio Department of Transportation in the amount of Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000.00) for infrastructure improvements in Fairview Park; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to retain a professional engineer to develop construction engineering plans, specifications and bidding documents for the Safe Routes to School infrastructure project; and

WHEREAS, the City will request proposals from companies capable of providing professional engineering services using the Ohio Department of Transportation's consultant selection procedures.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:**


SECTION 1. The Director of Service and Development is hereby authorized to request proposals from companies capable of providing professional engineering services for the Safe Routes to School infrastructure project using the Ohio Department of Transportation's consultant selection procedures.

SECTION 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a contract, as approved by the Board of Control, with the selected company for provision of professional design services for the Safe Routes to School infrastructure project.

SECTION 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare and to ensure that the professional design services needed for the Safe Routes to School infrastructure project are in place in order to comply with the grant requirements, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ANNUAL SALARIES OF THE ELECTED MEMBERS OF COUNCIL AND THE PRESIDENT OF COUNCIL AND REPEALING ORDINANCE 07-39 AND ALL OTHER ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT HEREWITH

WHEREAS, the Members of Council and the President of Council have not received a cost of living increase in salary since 2007; and

WHEREAS, the current salary of the Members of Council is Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000.00) should be adjusted to Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00), and the current salary of the President of Council is Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00), and should be adjusted to Twelve Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$12,500.00), consistent and comparable with other similar communities.

WHEREAS, the responsibilities of the Members of Council and the President of Council have broadened and expanded with the ever-increasing complexities and duties of the legislative branch of municipal government, it is appropriate at this time to make an upward adjustment to the council salaries that will be in place through 2019.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1. That effective January 1, 2016, the salaries of each elected member of Council of the City of Fairview Park shall be Twelve Thousand Hundred Dollars (\$12,000.00) annually, payable bi-weekly.


SECTION 2. That effective January 1, 2016, the salary of the President of Council shall be Twelve Thousand Five Dollars (\$12,500) annually, payable bi-weekly.

SECTION 3. That Ordinance 07-39, passed June 18, 2007, and any ordinance or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith, be, and the same are hereby repealed.



AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE SALARY AND COMPENSATION OF THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, OHIO, AND REPEALING ORDINANCE 07-38 AND ALL OTHER ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT HERewith

WHEREAS, the office of the Mayor has not received a cost of living increase in salary since 2007; and

WHEREAS, the duties and responsibilities of the office of Mayor have broadened and expanded with the ever-increasing complexities of managing a municipal government; and

WHEREAS, the current salary of the Mayor is Seventy-Seven Thousand Three Hundred Twenty-Five Dollars (\$77,325.00) should be adjusted to ~~Eighty One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$81,500.00)~~ **Eighty Four Thousand Dollars (\$84,000.00)**, consistent and comparable with other similar communities.

WHEREAS, based on the aforesaid duties and responsibilities, it is appropriate at this time to make an upward adjustment to the Mayor's salary that will be in place through 2019.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1. That effective January 1, 2016, the annual salary of the Mayor of the City of Fairview Park shall be ~~Eighty One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$81,500.00)~~ **Eighty Four Thousand Dollars (\$84,000.00)** per year, payable bi-weekly.


SECTION 2. That the salary provided for in Section 1 herein shall be effective for the Mayor's term of office commencing January 1, 2016 and thereafter.



SECTION 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.


