Whereas, City Council has been apprised that Fairview Park residents, Thomas P. Ratvasky, Stephanie J. Black, Wensheng Huang and Rohit Shastry were honored with NASA's Highest Honor, the Agency Honor Award, at a ceremony held on September 12, 2014 and would like to congratulate them on their recognition; and

Whereas, Thomas P. Ratvasky, was recognized with the Outstanding Leadership Medal for a profound and indelible contribution to icing flight research; and

Whereas, Stephanie J. Black was awarded the Exceptional Administrative Achievement Medal for exceptional achievement in improving the management support of the Space Operations Project Office and enabling successful execution of NASA's goals in human spaceflight. Stephanie was also acknowledged for forty-years of service with NASA; and

Whereas, honorees Wensheng Huang and Rohit Shastry received the Early Career Achievement Medal for their outstanding early career performance and leadership in electric propulsion that enables future science and exploration missions.

A RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING

ETHAN HALL AND JESSICA SASSANO

ON THEIR ACHIEVEMENTS AT THE US NATIONAL FIGURE SKATING CHAMPIONSHIPS

Whereas, Fairview Park residents, Ethan Hall, 15 and Jessica Sassano, 10, skating as a pair team for one year, competed in the U.S. Midwestern Sectional Figure Skating Championships in the Juvenile Pairs division and finished fourth, qualifying them to compete in the 2015 U.S. National Figure Skating Championships Juvenile Pairs Division; Ethan has been skating competitively since the age of 12, and he and Jessica have been skating together for two years; and

Whereas, at the Sectional competition, Jessica and Ethan were given awards for their execution of a death spiral and performance of their choreographed step sequence; and

Whereas, at the U.S. National Figure Skating Championships held in Greensboro, NC on January 17, 2015, Jessica and Ethan competed against the top 11 pair teams in the United States and placed 4th, earning them a pewter medal. Jessica and Ethan skated to the song "Transylvania Lullaby" and received top scores for Performance, Execution, and Interpretation at the Juvenile level; Jessica was the youngest competitor in the Juvenile pairs level to receive a medal; and

Whereas, Jessica and Ethan's achievements are the result of their talent, hard work, teamwork, and determination, and the love, support, and encouragement of Jessica's parents, Melanie and Jim Sassano, Ethan's parents, Sue and Kenneth Hall, their coach Chris Mattern, and their siblings, grandparents, and friends; and

Whereas, Jessica and her coach, Chris Mattern, were invited to skate at the launch of Dubai's new Figure Skating Academy from January 26th through February 2, 2015; Jessica and Coach Mattern performed two pair routines and Jessica performed a solo routine; when Jessica was not performing she was able to tour the city of Dubai and become acquainted with the culture of the United Arab Emirates.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:





A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UNDER THE STATE OF OHIO DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES RECREATIONAL TRAILS GRANT PROGRAM, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio, through the Recreational Trails grant program, administered by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, administers financial assistance for public recreation purposes; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview Park desires financial assistance under the Recreational Trails grant program to construct a new multi-use trail at Tri-City Park; and

WHEREAS, the most competitive of Recreational Trails grant applications include a local match by the applicant equal to or exceeding twenty percent (20%) of the total project cost.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Council of the City of Fairview Park hereby approves the filing of an application for financial assistance under the Recreational Trails grant program to construct a new multi-use trail at Tri-City Park.

SECTION 2. That the Mayor of the City of Fairview Park is authorized and directed to execute and file an application with the Ohio Department of Natural Resources and to provide all information and documentation required to become eligible for possible funding assistance.

SECTION 3. That this Council does agree to obligate the funds, to be taken from the Recreation Fund (230), required to satisfactorily complete the proposed project, including as part of the application a local match equaling twenty percent (20%) of the project cost, and become eligible for reimbursement under the terms of the Recreational Trails grant program, the specific cost to the City to be determined under the Tri-City Council of Governments Agreement.


SECTION 4. That the Clerk of Council is hereby authorized to attach a certified copy of this Resolution to be attached to the City of Fairview Park's Recreational Trails grant application prior to its filing.

SECTION 5. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.



AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UNDER THE STATE OF OHIO, DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL PROGRAM FOR NON-INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAMMING, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the United States Congress has set aside monies for Safe Routes to School projects through the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, local public agencies can apply for these monies and be selected for funding by the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Fairview Park Safe Routes to School Initiative is an activity eligible to receive federal transportation funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Council of the City of Fairview Park hereby approves the filing of an application for financial assistance under the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation Safe Routes to School program to fund non-infrastructure programming contained in the Fairview Park Safe Routes to School Travel Plan, Attachment "A" hereto.

SECTION 2. That the Mayor of the City of Fairview Park is authorized and directed to execute and file an application with the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation and to provide all information and documentation required to become eligible for possible funding assistance.

SECTION 3. The total cost of the project is estimated not to exceed Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000), of which the City of Fairview Park, if awarded the funds, agrees to pay one hundred percent (100%) of the construction cost over and above the maximum amount provided by the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation.

SECTION 4. Upon completion of the described project, the City of Fairview Park shall: (1) provide adequate reports and verification of work performed; and (2) provide a detailed plan for sustaining the program once funding is concluded.

SECTION 5. If the application is approved for the funding, the Mayor of the City of Fairview Park is hereby empowered to enter into a contract with the Director of the Ohio Department of Transportation necessary to complete the above described project.

SECTION 6. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 7. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare and for the further reason that the application must be submitted by the March 2, 2015 deadline, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
