A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING DONATIONS FROM THE FAIRVIEW PARK
COMMUNITY COUNCIL, THE FAIRVIEW PARK GARDEN CLUB AND THE FAIRVIEW
PARK CHAMBER OF COMMERCE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY







A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING APRIL AS SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH IN
THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

Whereas, Sexual Assault Awareness Month is intended to draw attention to the fact that sexual violence is widespread and impacts every community member of the City of Fairview Park, Ohio; and

Whereas, Rape, sexual assault, and sexual harassment impact our community as seen by statistics indicating that one in five women and one in 71 men will be raped at some point in their lives (Black et al., 2011).; and

Whereas, Child sexual abuse prevention must be a priority to confront the reality that one in six boys and one in four girls will experience a sexual assault before the age 18 (Dube et al., 2005).; and

Whereas, Young people experience heightened rates of sexual violence, and youth ages 12-17 were 2.5 times as likely to be victims of rape or sexual assault (Snyder & Sickmund, 2006).; and

Whereas, We must work together to educate our community about sexual violence prevention, supporting survivors, and speaking out against harmful attitudes and actions; and

Whereas, With leadership, dedication, and encouragement, there is evidence that we can be successful in preventing sexual violence in the city of Fairview Park, Ohio through increased education, awareness, and community involvement; and

Whereas, Fairview Park City Council strongly supports the efforts of national, state, and local partners, and of every citizen, to actively engage in public and private efforts to prevent sexual violence. It's time for all of us to start conversations, take appropriate action and support one another to create a safer environment for all.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW
PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1: That we, Fairview Park City Council, join advocates and communities across the country in playing an active role to prevent sexual violence. Along with the United States Government and State of Ohio, we do hereby proclaim April as "Sexual Assault Awareness Month!"




SECTION 3: That this Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
