AN ORDINANCE AMENDING FAIRVIEW PARK CODIFIED ORDINANCE SECTIONS 911.15 AND 911.16 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES CHAPTER 911 ENTITLED, "SEWER USE AND RATE" AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Director of Water Reclamation for the City of Cleveland (Cleveland Water) has advised the City that sections of Chapter 911 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Fairview Park require amending to reflect changes made by the Cleveland Water, the City's billing agent, from quarterly to monthly; and

WHEREAS, Section 911.15 of the Codified Ordinance of the City of Fairview Park needs to be amended to adjust the rates contained therein, to outline expenses properly payable and maintain a single fund for the collection of sewer charges and payment of any and all expenses related to the City's sewer system; and,

WHEREAS, Section 911.16 (a) of the Codified Ordinance of the City of Fairview Park needs to be amended to reflect the billing change from quarterly to monthly.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That Section 911.15 of the Codified Ordinance of the City of Fairview Park be amended as follows:

911.15 CHARGES AND RATES.

(a) Pursuant to the authority contained in Ohio R.C. 729.49 and related sections, and in order to provide a fund for the payment of all the necessary costs and expenses of the management, maintenance, operation and repair of the sewerage system, storm sewer system and sewerage pumping, treatment and disposal works, including but not limited to, debt service costs, construction and reconstruction costs, sewer maintenance and improvement costs and to meet the current obligations of the City as a party to agreements concerning the Rocky River Sanitary Sewer District and the North Olmsted Sewer District, and to ~~provide~~ **maintain** a fund to pay the future costs for such activities, there is hereby levied upon every person, firm or corporation, and each and every water consumer in the City of Fairview Park, a ~~sewer service rental charge~~ **of a monthly minimum rate charge of thirteen dollars (\$13.00) per .333 Mcf (Three hundred thirty-three thousandth cubic foot) per 1,000 cubic feet** ~~shall be charged for the first 1,000 cubic feet or a fraction thereof~~ of water consumed each ~~quarter~~ **month** as shown by the records of the water department of the City of Cleveland based upon actual water meter readings.

As shown in the historical chart herein:

The sewer service or rental charge shall be as follows:

~~Beginning February 1, 2010 \$33.00 per 1000 cubic foot~~
~~Beginning February 1, 2011 \$36.00 per 1000 cubic foot~~
~~Beginning February 1, 2012 \$39.00 per 1000 cubic foot~~
Beginning January 1, 2017 \$13.00 per 0.333 Mcf

(b) Any and all sewer service or rental charges collected shall be deposited in the Fairview Park Sewer Fund and will be used to pay any and all expenses incurred as outlined in 911.15 (a) as set forth above and in accordance with all applicable ordinances and provisions of the Ohio Revised Code.

(c) For extra-strength wastes, the following surcharges shall be assessed in accordance with Section 911.08.

BOD \$0.18/lb; SS \$0.313/lb; P \$0.54/lb; O/G \$0.08/lb
~~BOD \$0.06/lb; SS \$0.043/lb; P \$0.18/lb; O/G \$0.266/lb~~

The proportionality of the above user charges shall be reviewed at least every two years to insure sufficient revenue and that each user pays its proportionate share of OM&R costs. Adjustments shall be made with the changes in water consumption by user classes. The review shall be the responsibility of the Mayor or official designate. Each user shall receive annual notification of the rate and portion of sewer service charge attributable to OM&R costs of wastewater treatment services.

SECTION 2. That Section 911.16 of the Codified Ordinance of the City of Fairview Park be amended as follows:

- (a) The sewer service or rental charges as hereinbefore established shall be computed ~~quarterly~~ **monthly** and shall be included as a separate item or charge on each ~~quarterly~~ **monthly** water bill, and included in such charge shall be a collection fee established by and for the benefit of the City of Cleveland, which it shall retain for each billing made by such City, whether such bill is collected or not.

SECTION 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare and to immediately implement the changes to the ordinance, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH GO2IT GROUP FOR PROFESSIONAL SUPPORT SERVICES FOR THE CITY'S COMPUTER SYSTEMS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the City's computer systems require monthly maintenance and periodic support services; and

WHEREAS, Go2IT Group has provided the necessary professional computer services for the past several years, and the City, at its option can extend the contract for an additional year for the services to maintain and operate the City's computer services from October 1, 2016 to September 30, 2017, and it is in the best interest to extend the contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Go2IT Group to provide professional computer maintenance and support services for the City's computer systems in an amount not to exceed Thirty-Three Thousand Dollars (\$33,000.00) for the period October 1, 2016 to September 30, 2017.

SECTION 2. The cost of the professional services contract with Go2IT Group shall be paid from the General Fund (100) **and the Recreation Fund (232) (230) and the Permanent Improvement Fund (260)** as determined by the Finance Director.

SECTION 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare and to immediately provide for continued computer maintenance service, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH MCGOWAN AND COMPANY FOR THE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES OF PROVIDING INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS OF COMPREHENSIVE GENERAL LIABILITY, POLICE PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY, FIREFIGHTER/AMBULANCE ATTENDANTS LIABILITY, BOILER AND MACHINERY INSURANCE, COMPREHENSIVE AUTOMOBILE AND PHYSICAL DAMAGE LIABILITY, PUBLIC OFFICIALS LIABILITY, PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT COVERAGES, "UMBRELLA" COVERAGE, AND CYBER PROTECTION COVERAGE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the City utilizes McGowan and Company's professional services to obtain necessary insurance coverage including cyber protection coverage; and,

WHEREAS, McGowan and Company has obtained insurance coverage determined by the Finance Director to best serve the City's needs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor be and is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with McGowan and Company for the Comprehensive General Liability, Police Professional Liability, Firefighters/Ambulance Attendance Liability, Boiler and Machinery Insurance, Comprehensive Automobile and Physical Damage Liability, Public Officials Liability, Property and Equipment, "Umbrella" Coverage, and cyber protection coverage for the period of October 1, 2016 to September 30, 2017.

SECTION 2. That the cost of the Comprehensive General Liability insurance and Cyber insurance coverage for October 1, 2016 to September 30, 2017, not to exceed One Hundred Fifty-Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00), shall be paid from the General Fund (100.7790.5221100).

SECTION 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare: and for the further reason that the present insurance expires September 30, 2016; and provided it receives the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.



AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF ADA ACCESSIBLE PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT AT GRANNIS PARK AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, on September 6, 2016, Council passed Ordinance 16-34, approved by the Mayor on September 7, 2016, authorizing the Mayor enter into a contract with Snider Recreation Inc. North Royalton, OH 44133 for the purchase and installation of playground equipment at Grannis Park; and;

WHEREAS, Ordinance 16-34 needs to be repealed and replaced to include the full amount of the grant and the costs to the city need to be included to authorize acceptance of grant; and

WHEREAS, the Recreation Department is in need of replacing and updating the equipment at Grannis Park.

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview Park was awarded a NatureWorks grant for seventy-five percent (75%) of the project cost, by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources to purchase a new play area at Morton Park; and

WHEREAS, Council approved Ordinance 16-31 on August 8, 2016, authorizing the City of Fairview Park to participate in national and state joint purchasing programs; and.

WHEREAS, Snider Recreation, Inc. is an authorized national and state vendor and the equipment are approved items on the State contract vendor list.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. The Mayor is here authorized to enter into a contract with Snider Recreation, Inc, North Royalton, OH 44133, an authorized vendor who offers such equipment to the City at a price determined by the General Services Administration for the State of Ohio and the National Joint Powers Alliance (NJPA).

SECTION 2. That the total cost of the purchase for the purchase and installation of the equipment, in an amount not to exceed One Hundred Eighty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$185,000), that will be paid from the Recreation Fund (230).

SECTION 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare and so that the order for the vehicle may be placed as soon as possible to provide for timely delivery, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO SEEK FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FROM THE OHIO PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION STATE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT AND/OR LOCAL TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMS FOR FUNDING FOR THE CLIFFORD DRIVE SEWER REPLACEMENT PROJECT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the State Capital Improvement Program and the Local Transportation Improvement Program both provide financial assistance to political subdivisions for capital improvements to public infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview Park is planning to make capital improvements to the Clifford Drive sewers; and

WHEREAS, the infrastructure improvement herein above described is considered to be a priority need for the community and is a qualified project under the Ohio Public Works Commission programs; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Service and Development and Mackay Engineering for the City of Fairview Park have conducted a capital inventory and needs assessment and have determined that it is necessary to submit an application for financial assistance for the Clifford Drive Sewer Replacement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make an application to request funds from the District One Public Works Integrating Committee of Cuyahoga County and the Ohio Public Works Commission for the Clifford Drive Sewer Replacement Project.

SECTION 2. That the Mayor is further authorized to enter into any agreements as may be necessary and appropriate for obtaining such financial assistance in conjunction with the recommendations of the Director of Public Service and Development and Mackay Engineering, and approved as to form by the Director of Law, all in accordance with all authority granted to and limitations upon the Director of Finance.

SECTION 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this council, and that all deliberations of this council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 4. A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING SEPTEMBER AS NATIONAL SUICIDE PREVENTION AWARENESS MONTH AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, suicide is a serious but preventable public health problem that can have lasting harmful effects on individuals, families, and communities; and

WHEREAS, each year, Ohio loses between 1,200 and 1,500 of our citizens due to death by suicide. Nationally, suicide is the tenth leading causes of death overall and the second leading cause of death among Americans aged 10 to 34; and

WHEREAS, the best way to minimize risk of suicide is to learn about risk factors, recognize warning signs and take them seriously, and know how to respond to possibly save a life; and

WHEREAS, effective prevention strategies are needed to promote awareness of suicide while also promoting prevention, resilience, and a commitment to social change; and
