AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE TO TRADE-IN (1) SULLAIR 185 PORTABLE AIR COMPRESSOR AND TO PURCHASE (1) NEW SULLAIR 185 PORTABLE AIR COMPRESSOR AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview Park owns a Sullair 185 Portable Air Compressor, operated by the Public Service Department, which is approximately 30 years old, inoperable and not being used; and,

WHEREAS, Southeastern Equipment Company, Incorporated will take trade-in of aforementioned Air Compressor, for a credit in the amount of Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750) and utilize the proceeds to offset the purchase of (1) new Sullair Portable Air Compressor to reduce the cost of the new air compressor.

WHEREAS, the Air Compressor can be purchased from Southeastern Equipment Company, Incorporated, an authorized vendor who offers such equipment at a competitively bid price determined by the Department of Transportation for the State of Ohio (ODOT).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. The Director of Finance is hereby authorized to trade-in the aforementioned Air Compressor to Southeastern Equipment Company, Incorporated to reduce the price of a new air compressor and is further authorized to purchase a new Sullair 185 Portable Air Compressor from Southeastern Equipment Company, Incorporated, an authorized vendor who offers such equipment to the City at a competitively bid price determined by ODOT.

SECTION 2. That the cost of the purchase of the equipment shall be paid from the Permanent Improvement Fund – Service Equipment (Fund 260) at a cost not to exceed Twenty-Two Thousand Dollars (\$22,000), less the authorized trade-in, to be paid in one lump sum


SECTION 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.


SECTION 4. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare and to immediately dispose of old equipment, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the members of Council eligible to vote, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.


SECTION 5. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare and so that the order for the equipment may be placed as soon as possible to provide for timely delivery, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ACCEPT GRANT FUNDS FROM THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY DIVISION OF MEDICAL SERVICES FOR THE FIRE DEPARTMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, a grant to the Fire Department, in the amount of Four Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$4,750.00) has been made by the Ohio Department of Public Safety Division of Emergency Medical Services.







A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING AND AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION TO THE NORTHEAST OHIO AREAWIDE COORDINATING AGENCY (“NOACA”) FOR THE 2017 TRANSPORTATION FOR LIVABLE COMMUNITIES INITIATIVE (“TLCI”) PLANNING GRANT PROGRAM AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, NOACA provides funding through TLCI for planning projects that integrate transportation and land use planning, promote livability, and advance the goals of NOACA’s long-range transportation plan for Northeast Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview Park is submitting an application to NOACA for TLCI funding to undertake a lane reduction planning study for the portion of Lorain Road within City limits (“Project”) and a resolution supporting and authorizing that application is required; and

WHEREAS, the TLCI program provides a one hundred percent (100%) reimbursement of costs, requiring the applicant to first expend funds and then request reimbursement from NOACA or the award may be received in the form of technical assistance, which includes NOACA staff hours allocated to the Project; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview Park agrees to abide by all federal requirements as a sub-recipient of federal transportation funds, including Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Americans with Disabilities Act, and including all applicable federal procurement requirements; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview Park agrees to be responsible for managing any and all subcontracting agencies, organizations, or consultants if awarded on a reimbursement basis; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview Park agrees to complete the agreed upon scope of services or will forfeit current and future TLCI awards and repay TLCI funds expended on unfinished projects; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Council of the City of Fairview Park hereby authorizes the submittal of an application to NOACA, acting as designated recipient of the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) funds, for the TLCI grant program and to execute a contract with NOACA if selected for funding.

SECTION 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 3. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare; and for the further reason that the application must be submitted by December 14, 2016 deadline and provided it receives the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**A RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING
SAINT MARY MAGDALENE BYZANTINE CATHOLIC CHURCH
ON THEIR 50TH ANNIVERSARY**

WHEREAS, St. Mary Magdalene Byzantine Catholic Church is celebrating the 50th Anniversary of its founding; and

WHEREAS, on November 7, 1966, Bishop Nicholas T. Elko appointed Father Michael Moran as the first Pastor of the newly established parish of St. Mary Magdalene Byzantine Catholic Church in Fairview Park, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the church celebrated its first Divine Liturgy on November 27, 1966 at Parkview Elementary School with Father Moran and two hundred fifty attendees. A year later, the church found a permanent home at 5390 West 220 Street in Fairview Park, which opened with a temporary church and parish center in 1970; and

WHEREAS, the mosaic of St. Mary Magdalene, designed by artist Frank Marchione, was commissioned by the parish in 1987. The inspirational mosaic is composed of imported Italian marble, ceramic, and tiles; and

WHEREAS, in May, 1993, construction began on a permanent church, and culminated with the celebration of its first Divine Liturgy in the new church on Christmas Eve. Over the years, the church has continued to grow and improve through its many new appointments, memorials and congregation. In 2013, St. Mary Magdalene welcomed into the parish family the former parishioners of St. Gregory the Theologian Church in Lakewood, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, in 2016, St. Mary Magdalene is not only celebrating its founding, but 50 years of service and fellowship in the community of Fairview Park.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1: That the City Council of Fairview Park join in expressing, on behalf of all the citizens of the City of Fairview Park, their congratulations on the 50th Anniversary of St. Mary Magdalene Byzantine Catholic Church and shows its appreciation for its contributions to the enhancement and enrichment of Fairview Park's religious, cultural and civic history.

SECTION 2: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.
