AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE AND DEVELOPMENT TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS AND THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE LOWEST AND BEST BIDDER AS DETERMINED BY THE BOARD OF CONTROL TO MAKE STREETScape IMPROVEMENTS AND REPAIRS TO LORAIN ROAD FROM THE WESTERN CORPORATION LIMIT TO WEST 221 STREET, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the project scope is comprised of streetscape improvements and repairs to Lorain Road from the western corporation limit to West 221 Street, including tree and shrub plantings; the installation of benches; restoration of tree lawn through concrete removal and installation of lawn and landscaped areas; sidewalk and apron repairs; and installation of landscaped islands (bump outs) to better define parking and reduce crosswalk lengths at intersections; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Department of Transportation (“ODOT”) and Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency (“NOACA”) have committed funding to the Project in the amount of One Million Two Hundred Fifteen Thousand One Hundred and Seventy Six Dollars (\$1,215,176) through the Transportation Alternatives Program (“TAP”) and Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (“SAFETEA-LU”) fund for construction activities; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview Park (“City”) has committed the required Two Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$240,000) for construction activities; and

WHEREAS, the City must advertise and enter into an agreement with an Ohio Department of Transportation (“ODOT”) Pre-Qualified Contractor to complete said construction; and

WHEREAS, the total estimated construction cost is One Million Two Hundred Seventy One Thousand Four Hundred Seventy Five Dollars (\$1,271,475) as determined by the design plans and specifications.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1. That the Director of Public Service and Development is hereby authorized to advertise for and accept bids for streetscape improvements and repairs to Lorain Road from the western corporation limit to West 221 Street, based on the plans and specifications prepared by CT Consultants, Inc.

SECTION 2. That the Mayor is authorized to enter into a contract with the lowest and best bidder as determined by the Board of Control for streetscape improvements and repairs in the above-specified location, in an amount not to exceed One Million Three Hundred Fifteen Thousand One Hundred Seventy Six Dollars (\$1,315,176), which includes a construction contingency not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the actual awarded contract price, to be paid from the Capital Projects Fund (Fund 811).

SECTION 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this council, and that all deliberations of this council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare; and for the further reason that the improvements and repairs should be done as soon as weather permits; and provided it receives the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT FOR CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION AND INSPECTION SERVICES FOR THE LORAIN ROAD STREETScape PROJECT WITH AN OHIO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION PREQUALIFIED CONSULTANT AS DETERMINED BY THE BOARD OF CONTROL AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Lorain Road Streetscape Project (“Project”) scope is comprised of streetscape improvements and repairs to Lorain Road from the western corporation limit to West 221 Street, including tree and shrub plantings; the installation of benches; restoration of tree lawn through concrete removal and installation of lawn and landscaped areas; sidewalk and apron repairs; and installation of landscaped islands (bump outs) to better define parking and reduce crosswalk lengths at intersections; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Department of Transportation (“ODOT”) and Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency (“NOACA”) have committed funding to the Project in the amount of One Million Two Hundred Fifteen Thousand One Hundred and Seventy Six Dollars (\$1,215,176) through the Transportation Alternatives Program (“TAP”) and Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (“SAFETEA-LU”) fund for construction activities; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview Park (“City”) has committed the required Two Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$240,000) for construction activities; and

WHEREAS, ODOT procedures require that the City retain an ODOT pre-qualified consultant for construction administration and inspection services for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Control shall adhere to and be in compliance with State of Ohio statute during its proposal evaluation and selection of a firm for the required services.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute an agreement for construction administration and inspection services for the Lorain Road Streetscape Project with an ODOT pre-qualified consultant as determined by the Board of Control for an amount not to exceed One Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$140,000) to be paid from the Capital Projects Fund (811).

SECTION 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare; and for the further reason that the improvements and repairs should be done as soon as weather permits; and provided it receives the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE AND DEVELOPMENT TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS AND THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE LOWEST AND BEST BIDDER AS DETERMINED BY THE BOARD OF CONTROL TO RENOVATE THE EXISTING POLICE DEPARTMENT LOCKER ROOM AND TO ADD A WOMEN'S LOCKER ROOM AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, City Hall, including the Police Department ("Department"), was constructed and dedicated in 1968; and

WHEREAS, currently, there is not a designated women's restroom or shower contained within the Department, and female employees must utilize a converted closet as a makeshift locker room; and

WHEREAS, the existing men's locker room facilities have not been renovated or updated since their original construction in 1968; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview Park desires to provide high quality facilities for all of its emergency personnel, including female employees, and the proposed project is critical for creating and maintaining a productive, safe, healthy, and inclusive working environment; and

WHEREAS, Makovich & Pusti Architects, Inc. has prepared construction plans and bid specifications to expand the Department's existing locker room facilities, including the addition of a women's locker room, shower, and bathroom, and renovation to the aged and dilapidated men's facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview Park has been awarded fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) from Cuyahoga County through the Community Development Supplemental Grant ("CDSG") program to support the construction of women's restroom, shower, and locker room; and

WHEREAS, the total estimated construction cost for renovations to the men's locker room and the addition of a women's locker room is two hundred forty thousand dollars (\$240,000), as determined by the construction plans and bid specifications; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1. That the Director of Public Service and Development is hereby authorized to advertise and accept bids for the repair of the Police Department Locker Room Renovation Project.

SECTION 2. That the Mayor is authorized to enter into a contract with the lowest and best bidder as determined by the Board of Control for the repair of the Police Department Locker Room Renovation Project in an amount not to exceed two hundred sixty-four thousand dollars (\$264,000), which includes a construction contingency not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the actual awarded contract amount, to be paid from the Permanent Improvement Fund (Fund 260).

SECTION 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this council, and that all deliberations of this council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare; and for the further reason that the Project must be completed by December 31, 2019, as required by the 2019 Community Development Supplemental Grant Program; and provided it receives the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO PURCHASE COMPUTER EQUIPMENT AND SOFTWARE FOR UPGRADES TO THE CITY'S COMPUTER SYSTEMS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, as of January, 2020, Microsoft will no longer provide support for its obsolete Windows 7 Operating System and/or Office 2010. Current users will no longer receive security updates as of that date leaving City computers vulnerable; and

WHEREAS, many end users at the City of Fairview Park currently utilize this software as part of their daily tasks; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview Park has begun the process of upgrading its outdated computer equipment and it is essential that utilized software is compatible with these upgrades. In addition, Microsoft Office programs used by City employees require yearly license renewals; and

WHEREAS, SHI International Corp. has been selected to provide the necessary software and hardware to ensure proper interface with upgraded systems as more fully set forth on Exhibit "A" attached.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to purchase computer hardware, software and licensing from SHI International Corp. for seventeen thousand six hundred thirty four dollars (\$17,634.00).

SECTION 2. The cost of the computer equipment provided by SHI International Corp. shall be paid from the Permanent Improvement Fund (260) as determined by the Director of Finance.

SECTION 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare and immediately provide for continued computer maintenance service and provided it receives the affirmative vote a majority plus one of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS FOR COLLECTION OF THE MONTHLY CHARGE FOR COLLECTION OF SOLID WASTE IN THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, OHIO FOR THE TAX YEARS 2020 AND 2021, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1. That the assessment of the cost and expense of solid waste collection for the tax years 2020 and 2021, in the amount of \$120 per year per residential parcel for each tax year, as reported to the Finance Director and now on file in the office of the Finance Director; be and the same is hereby adopted and confirmed, and that for the tax years 2020 and 2021, there be and are hereby levied and assessed upon each residential parcel that is subject to collection of solid waste by the City's vendor, the amount reported as aforesaid, which are not in excess of any statutory limitation; and said properties are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement.

SECTION 2. That the remainder of the entire cost of said improvement shall be paid out of the General Fund of the City of Fairview Park, Ohio.

SECTION 3. That this Council hereby finds and determines that the assessments now on file in the office of said Director are in the same proportion to the estimated assessments as originally filed as the actual cost of the above described improvement is to the estimated cost of the improvement as originally filed.

SECTION 4. That the assessment against each lot or parcel of land shall be payable in cash within thirty (30) days after the passage of this Ordinance, or at the option of the owner, in two (2) annual installments. All cash payments shall be made to the Director of Finance of the City. All assessments remaining unpaid at the expiration of said thirty (30) days shall be certified by the Clerk of Council to the County Fiscal Officer as provided by law, to be placed on the tax duplicate and collected as other taxed are collected.

SECTION 5. That the Clerk of this Council shall cause a notice of the passage of this Ordinance to be published once in a newspaper of general circulation in this City, and to continue on file in this office said assessments.

SECTION 6. That the Clerk of this Council is hereby directed to deliver a certified copy of this Ordinance to the County Fiscal Officer no later than September 9, 2019.

SECTION 7. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 8. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare; and for the further reason that it is necessary to provide funds for solid waste collection to protect the health, convenience, and welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Fairview Park and provided it receives the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 929.06 OF CHAPTER 929 ENTITLED, "SOLID WASTE COLLECTION CHARGES" OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Section 929.06 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Fairview Park was amended by Ordinance No. 17-39 to provide that the solid waste collection charges established by Chapter 929 shall expire December 31, 2019; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of Fairview Park to extend the charges established by Chapter 929 until December 31, 2021.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW PARK, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1. That Section 929.06 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Fairview Park shall be and is hereby amended as follows:

**“ 929.06      EXPIRATION**

The charges established under this Chapter shall expire on December 31, 201921.”

SECTION 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare and timely provide for the continuation of the charges under this ordinance, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
